The **Rising Star Award** kicked-off the awards portion of the evening. The recipient of this award must work in the industry for less than 5 years but demonstrate the potential to become a pivotal figure in the hospitality

community and exhibit excellence in their professional work endeavors. They excel in their role and are excited to learn more and grow within the hospitality industry. The 2025 Rising Star Award recipient is Claudia Gatewood, Event Coordinator at the Von Braun Center.

The next award does not recognize one individual's contributions to the hospitality industry but instead celebrates the impact an organization's team can make. The 2025 **Outstanding Team Award** winner is Arts Huntsville.

The **Red Ribbon Awards** are the highest honors for those working in the Hospitality Industry. To be nominated, the individual must be currently working in the hospitality industry and through their career have made outstanding contributions directly benefiting tourism. The person should actively work to enhance the economic impact of tourism in the community, as well as be a positive role model to others. One winner is selected from each of the four membership categories of the Huntsville-Madison County Hospitality Association.

The next award is one of the most coveted awards in our industry and has a long list of recipients who exemplify hospitality and who have made tremendous contributions to tourism and travel. Leaders across the hospitality industry are nominated by members of HMCHA for the prestigious **Pineapple Award**. This award is given to an individual who has been involved with a project that has had a major impact on the hospitality industry and/or has been involved in the improvement of an existing project or program that benefits tourism. The 2025 Pineapple Award recipient is Brenda Martin, Host of Inside Huntsville, to recognize and honor her decades of service as a leader and advocate promoting our community.

HMCHA created the **Lifetime Achievement Award** in honor and memory of B'lisa King in 2018. This award is not presented every year and is reserved to recognize an individual who has spent a significant portion of their career in the hospitality and travel profession – contributing to the betterment of the industry in a noteworthy and lasting way over an extended period. Someone who demonstrates outstanding service and has a goal of making the hospitality industry a great place to work within, as well as providing lasting experiences for those who travel to the area. This year's Lifetime Achievement Award recipient is Marie Arighi who recently retired after 35 years of working in Huntsville's hospitality and tourism sector, the last 25 of which she was Director of Sales and Event Services at the Von Braun Center.

Following the awards ceremony, the 2025 Huntsville/Madison County Hospitality Association Officers and Board of Directors were inducted, followed by the official introduction of the 2025 HMCHA President Jennifer Hoffman-Little of MH Hospitality.
